Though he had no training, he started experimenting with cotton, cloth, and other materials. People in his village didn't understand his efforts and began to spread rumours. Even his family turned against him. But Bablu remained focused on his goal, believing every woman deserved a safe and hygienic life.

Despite losing his wife, mother, and respect in the community, Bablu continued his experiments. He even tested his ideas on himself as no one else supported him. He struggled for all poor women who couldn't afford basic hygiene. Bablu proved that even in pain and rejection, we can find strength to help others. His story shows how a small act of love and courage can become a mission to change lives.

<u>Arunachalam Muruganantham: The Pad Man of India</u>

Arunachalam Muruganantham was born in Tamil Nadu to a humble family. His father was a handloom weaver, After his father passed away unexpectedly, Muruganantham had to drop out of school at the age of fourteen. He began working in a welding workshop to support his family. At 21, he got married and soon found that his wife used old rags during her menstrual cycle due to the high cost of sanitary napkins.

This discovery led him to start experiments to create low-cost sanitary pads. He faced many failures and strong opposition from society. His wife left him, his mother was disgraced, and the entire village looked down on him. But he did not give up. After years of trial and error, he found that sanitary napkins used pinewood pulp, not cotton. He went on to design simple and affordable machines to produce hygienic pads to help poor women.

His mission is to make menstrual hygiene affordable and to create jobs for women through self-help groups. Though he was a school dropout, he now gives talks at universities around the world. His life story was made into a film in 2018.
